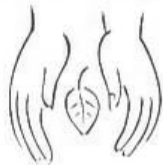

A Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends of St. Paul's:

Most of us like new things. Oh, I know that some of us like to hang on to the old stuff! On June 12, in most of our Christian churches, we will observe the Festival of Pentecost. I understand this to be a celebration of new things! For many of us, Acts Chapter 2 will be the scripture of the day! This chapter of Acts tells the story of how the Holy Spirit caused a unique happening that day. On that day, fifty days after Passover, devout Jews from many diverse lands had made the pilgrimage to Jerusalem to celebrate this popular festival of the Spring Harvest, remembering the goodness and bounty of God. But, as it turned out, this was no ordinary festival day. God's Holy Spirit took charge and made this event a 'new thing.' 

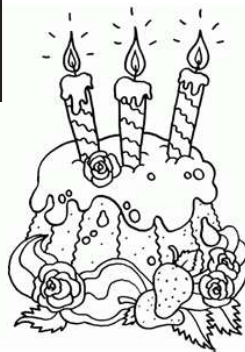
